### **Summer Splash**

If you would like your child to participate in water play, please bring in bathing suits, towels, water shoes, sunscreen & extra clothes! Water play is part of our Summer Splash curriculum and will start at the beginning of July.

### **Reminders:**

- Warmer weather is approaching, and we go outside each day as part of our daily routine. If you would like your child to wear sunscreen while at school, please turn in a new bottle of sunscreen to the office. If you choose not to bring in sunscreen, a note from your child's physician is required, along with UV clothing and a hat for outdoor play.
- You no longer need to fill out topical medication forms for sunscreen! Permission forms are included in the enrollment packets.
- Please make sure your child's cubby has weather appropriate changes of clothes (labeled with their name) and a lighter blanket for rest time.

### **Safety:**

**Running inside the school:** It is strongly discouraged, as it often leads to injury of one or more children.

**Cars left running with children inside:** For the safety of the children, please do not leave your vehicle running when dropping off and picking up your children.

**Summer heat and cars:** If outside temperature is 90°, temperature in a car can increase from 80° to 130° in ten to fifteen minutes. A person/child left in this situation would experience a body temperature increase to 106°- leading to heat stroke. Please note these helpful tips:

- 1) Look before you lock (backseat). Please keep your keys in your possession at all times.
- 2) Always lock the car door to prevent curious children from getting in.
- 3) If you see something, say something. Most car-heat related accidents are a result of failure of memory not failure of love.
